

Accessing the Homeland Security Information Network (HSIN)

The Homeland Security Information Network (HSIN) is a national secure and trusted Web-based portal for information sharing and collaboration between Federal, State, local, tribal, territorial, private-sector, and international partners engaged in the homeland security mission.



HSIN is made up of a growing network of communities, called communities of interest (COIs). HSIN provides secure, real-time collaboration tools, including a virtual meeting space, instant messaging and document sharing. HSIN allows partners to work together instantly, regardless of their location, to communicate, collaborate, and coordinate.

Membership in HSIN is based on communities of interest. To become a member, first decide which COIs meet your needs. If you need additional information about a particular COI, please contact the mission advocate listed as the point of contact.
